<u>Wind Cave National Park, The Mammoth Site</u>, and Dinner at <u>Custer State Park</u> <u>Game Lodge</u>

(Transportation will be provided. Buses will depart the Holiday Inn at 12:50 p.m.)

There will be two tours offered at Wind Cave National Park:



Garden of Eden Cave Tour

This 1-hour tour is the park's least strenuous tour. It is a wonderful sample of Wind Cave. Small amounts of all of the beautiful cave formations - boxwork, cave popcorn, and flowstone - are seen along this 1/3 mile tour. The tour is designed for people with limited time or abilities. It enters and leaves the cave by elevator with 150 steps along the tour route.



Natural Entrance Cave Tour

This tour includes a visit to the natural entrance of Wind Cave where visitors can see where the cave was discovered and learn how it got its name. Participants enter the cave through a man-made entrance and journey through the middle level of the cave. Wind Cave's famous boxwork is abundant throughout this trip. Most of the 300 stairs along this route are down. This moderately strenuous 2/3 mile tour lasts 1½ hours and exits the cave by elevator.

Good footwear is a must!

Crazy Horse Memorial and Mount Rushmore National Memorial

Crazy Horse Memorial

The Crazy Horse Memorial is a mountain monument under construction on privately held land in the Black Hills, in Custer County, South Dakota. It will depict the Oglala Lakota warrior, Crazy Horse, riding a horse and pointing to his tribal land. The memorial was commissioned by Henry Standing Bear, a Lakota elder, to be sculpted by Korczak Ziolkowski. It is operated by the Crazy Horse Memorial Foundation, a nonprofit organization.

We will enjoy a Native American taco buffet as well as hear the executive team at Crazy Horse Memorial speak about the monument's history, progress and plans. There will also be the opportunity to go up to the face of the memorial as a hosted group.

Following our time at Crazy Horse Memorial, the group will move to the Mount Rushmore National Memorial for the evening lighting ceremony. (A bus may head back to the Holiday Inn, depending on the number of people that choose to stay for the lighting ceremony.)



Mount Rushmore National Memorial

The Mount Rushmore lighting ceremony includes a film with the history of the presidents, the singing of a patriotic song and then all veterans in the audience are invited onto the stage to give their name and branch of service before the U.S. flag is lowered at the end of the evening. This patriotic and reflective event is a very memorable way to end the day.
