THEORY AND PRACTICE OF PROGRAMMING FOR PEOPLE WITH DEMENTIA AND THEIR CAREGIVER

This session will explore the theory and practice of museum education for people with dementia and their caregivers through experiential activities at the Carnegie Museum. During this full-day workshop, participants will learn about how museum teaching through dialogue may foster improved mood and reduced apathy in people with dementia and their caregivers (indeed, in all people!) Participants will practice active listening in the context of art-centered dialogues in the galleries. Collectively, we will look at, respond to, and interpret a work of art in the museum's collection. There will be plenty of time for discussion of both the theoretical and practical aspects of welcoming people with dementia and their caregivers to your museum or adapting this approach to theaters and other arts venues. Novice and experienced practitioners are welcome. *Participants will be given an hour to get lunch on their own.*
